## Kiddush Hashem Jar

### Supplies Needed:

- Two 4-ounce Mason jars
- 10 printed sheets of the attached flames
- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 pen
- Decorative materials to decorate 1 of the Mason jars

*Best for ages 3 through 8. The purpose of this activity is to help your child become aware of the unlimited daily opportunities there are to create a Kiddush Hashem.*

Print 10 pages of the attached document of flames and cut out the flames, placing them in one of the jars.

Decorate the other jar as desired, labeling it the "Kiddush Hashem Jar."

Explain to your child that each time they notice themselves "making a Kiddush Hashem" (defined in the table talk above) they should take a flame from the jar of empty flames, write it down (younger children can ask a sibling or adult to help them, or can draw a picture) and place it in the Kiddush Hashem Jar.

Create a point system within your family for each flame. For example, each flame can be worth 1 point, and when your child gets 50 points, he/she can earn a prize.

Decide whether to go through the jar at the end of each week or wait until the end of the month. As you go through each flame and read each Kiddush Hashem, keep track of your child's points.



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
